RAN JITSINH Gadhwal, Maharaja of erstwhile Baroda state, died of cancer in a private hospital here in the early hours of Thursday. He was 74.

Born in 1938, Ranjitsinh was the second son of Maharaja Pragnanrao. After the death of his elder brother Prithviraj, he succeeded the throne in 1993. He was also a member of the Rajwade Sanshodhan Mandal and the Rajwade Sanshodhan Mandal in Vadodra.

The proposal is under the purview of the Law and Justice Minister Shri. K. J. Somaiya.
